#### Locate a grade-level standard

Use the CA standards quick-links or your district resources. Choose the standard(s) that align with the project's focus.



# Turn the standard into a student-facing objective

Start with a measurable verb. Keep it observable & testable.



# Decide what evidence will show mastery

Name the artifact or product.

### **Reduce Mapping Errors**

- Objective begins with measurable verbObjective is student-facing (reads
- Evidence is observable (artifact, performance, rubric item)
- Only one standard is mapped per objective
- Objective fits within your project scope (time + supports)

#### Wording hacks (copy/paste starters)

- "Students will describe/compare/demonstrate..."
- "Students will construct a \_\_\_\_\_ and/or justify \_\_\_\_ using evidence."
- "Students will analyze \_\_\_\_\_."
